Executive Director's Message

Dear SETI Supporters,

2002 has been perhaps the most challenging year faced by The SETI League since its inception in 1994, but it has also been a year of great technical accomplishment. The global economic downturn precipitated by the events of September 2001 has severely impacted the fundraising efforts of all nonprofit ventures, including The SETI League, Inc. Yet we continue to experience modest membership growth. More importantly, we have enjoyed a significant increase the active, grass-roots participation of our members, which directly influences our ability to continue fulfilling our educational and scientific mission, despite an ongoing fiscal shortfall.

Upon the regrettable demise in 1998 of Orville N. Greene, the New York City patent attorney and civic activist who co-founded The SETI League, we were honored to receive a sizeable bequest from Mr. Greene's foundation. This most generous gift has formed the mainstay of The SETI League's budget for the past several years. Unfortunately, 2002 saw fully a ninety percent decrease in SETI League revenues other than membership dues and previously pledged support, necessitating a significant spend-down of our modest cash reserves. Your Board of Trustees and Officers have thus been devoting considerable energy during the past year to cost-containment and fundraising measures.

One measure which has modestly reduced our operating costs is a transitioning away from printing and postage, toward adopting electronic delivery means for SETI League press releases and other materials. It seems highly appropriate for an organization that seeks evidence of other civilizations through their electromagnetic communications to employ such means to fulfill its own internal communications needs! During the coming year, we anticipate delivering *SearchLites*, our quarterly newsletter, electronically to those of our members with the means to so receive it.


During 2002 The SETI League engaged in a search to secure professional fundraising assistance. This has resulting in our retaining the services of Mr. Brian Smith of Harvest Development, Jacksonville FL, on a part-time basis. Mr. Smith's first task was to survey members and supporters, gathering information from which he is now drawing up a formal Case for Support. We anticipate his significantly stepping up our fundraising efforts during the coming year, so your staff can return to concentrating on their primary technical duties.

In the pages of this, our first formal Annual Report, you will find details of our successes with regard to The SETI League's educational, scientific, technological and outreach programs. We thank you for your interest, enthusiasm, and generous support of our global mission.



Program Service Accomplishments – Science

During 2002, The SETI League and its members made the following contributions to direct scientific research and observation:

- Coordinated 119 Project Argus radio telescopes in 22 countries, built and operated by volunteers, logging in excess of 100,000 hours of astrophysical observations.
- Operated W2ETI Moonbounce Beacon, providing 2160 hours of free microwave calibration signals to the world's amateur and professional radio telescopes.
- Provided Committee participation, webmastering, and web hosting services to the SETI Permanent Study Group of the International Academy of Astronautics.
- 228 members contributed more than 100 years of processing time to the SETI@home distributed computing experiment.

Operating under the amateur radio callsign W2ETI, antennas of The SETI League's 1296 MHz Lunar Reflective Calibration Beacon track the Moon twelve hours a day, under computer control, reflecting microwave signals the surface of the Moon to provide precise calibration signals for the world's amateur and professional radio telescopes.





Program Service Accomplishments – Technology

During 2002, The SETI League and its members made the following contributions to technology design and development:

- Completed Phase 1, Physical Structures, of the Very Small Array radio telescope prototype.
- Filed US Patent Application #20020063657, Adaptive Microwave Antenna Array.
- Coordinated and archived four closed technical email lists.
- Inducted eight amateur radio astronomers into the Extra-Terrestrial Century Club.



Built behind our Executive Director's home in central Pennsylvania, the Very Small Array, a prototype for future radio telescopes, underwent preliminary testing throughout the winter of 2002.



Program Service Accomplishments – Public Education

During 2002, The SETI League and its members made the following contributions to educating the public on SETI science and technology:

- Conducted SETICon02, The SETI League's second annual Technical Symposium, and published extensive Proceedings.
- Distributed over 100 copies of "Tune In The Universe!", a radio amateur's guide to the Search for Extra-Terrestrial Intelligence.
- SETI League personnel delivered over 30 public lectures on radio astronomy techniques and related SETI science.
- Published more than a dozen technical articles in the popular and scientific press.
- Launched "Contact In Context," a new Web-based peer-reviewed SETI journal.
- Provided webmastering services to the Society of Amateur Radio Astronomers.

Program Service Accomplishments – Media and Outreach

During 2002, The SETI League and its members engaged in the following media and outreach activities:

- Published four issues of SearchLites, the quarterly newsletter of The SETI League, Inc.
- Coordinated and archived two open public email lists.
- Distributed eleven Press Releases and twelve Editorials to over 700 media outlets worldwide.
- Filed 52 weekly updates to The SETI League's extensive website, bringing its total document count to over 2500 pages.
- 63 volunteer Regional Coordinators in 50 countries conducted more than 100 print and broadcast media briefings and interviews.
- Executive Director performed SETI-related concerts at six different conventions and professional meetings in four countries.
- Presented the eighth annual Giordano Bruno Memorial Award, the first annual Orville N. Greene Service Award, and twelve SETI SuperStar Awards.

Grant History

During 2002 The SETI League, Inc. achieved mixed success in applying for grant funding to support our various educational and scientific projects. We prepared and submitted four competitive grant applications to outside agencies, from which one grant was awarded, and three rejected. The denial letters cited no fundamental flaws in our research proposals, reflecting instead on overall economic conditions. 






Trustees and Officers

Notes to the Audited Financial Statements

THE SETI LEAGUE, INC. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2002 AND 2001

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a. Nature of operations

The SETI League, Inc. (the Organization) sponsors astronomical research, education, lectures and events in the search for evidence of extra-terrestrial intelligence.

b. Basis of accounting

The Organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the cash basis of accounting.

c. Cash and cash equivalents

The Organization considers all highly liquid investments to be cash equivalents.

d. Support and revenue

The Organization is primarily supported by donor contributions and grants. During the years presented, more than 90% of total contributions were received from three major donors.

Contributions and grants received are reported as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions. Contributions that are restricted by the donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions expire in the same year in which the contributions are recognized.

e. Income taxes

The Organization is exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Organization has no unrelated business income and accordingly the financial statements include no provision for income taxes.





Change in Accountants

The SETI League, Inc. is a Nonprofit Educational and Scientific Corporation registered in the State of New Jersey. From its inception in 1994 through 2001, The SETI League has retained the accounting firm of Brand Sonnenschine LLP, New York, NY, to prepare its annual IRS Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax. Because we now have revenues in excess of \$100,000 US per year, we have been required since 1999 to submit to the State of New Jersey, Division of Consumer Affairs, Charitable Registration and Investigation Section, an annual independent financial audit.

The Treasurer of The SETI League, Martin Schreiber CPA, being an employee of Brand Sonnenschine LLP, it would be considered a conflict of interest for that firm to perform our required annual audit. Upon the recommendation of Mr. Schreiber, The SETI League retained the services of Mr. A. J. Goldberger, CPA, of Brooklyn NY, to perform an independent audit of our 1999 Financial Statements. No audit was required by the State of New Jersey for the year 2000.

Mr. Goldberger having subsequently retired from the practice of accounting, The SETI League retained the accounting firm of William R. Hoffman, Ltd., Williamsport PA, to perform an independent audit of our 2001 Financial Statements.

Because it is both cost-effective and efficient to have the required Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax and the annual Independent Financial Audit performed concurrently, the Board of Trustees of The SETI League, Inc. at its Annual Meeting in April 2002, authorized its Executive Director to retain the services of the William R. Hoffman, Ltd. Accounting firm to prepare both documents for the 2002 tax year. Since no employee of William R. Hoffman, Ltd. is in any way affiliated with The SETI League, Inc., it is the opinion of SETI League treasurer Mr. Schreiber that such activity in no way constitutes a conflict of interest. Thus, it is anticipated that the accounting firm of William R. Hoffman, Ltd. will continue to serve as both Accountants to, and independent auditors for, The SETI League, Inc., until further notice.
